Dear Brothers and Sisters.

Learning Islam, like all types of learning, is an enlightenment. It is a cure for the illness of ignorance which affects our ability to function as human beings.

The significance of learning Islam, however, relies on the fact that it is a guidance for success. The Qu'ran beautifully states that acquiring knowledge and being knowledgeable is an elevation. It also emphasizes the stipulation of both piety and sincerity as prerequisites necessary to absorb the knowledge, and to realize the benefits that it provides.



(وَ الَّذِينَ لَا يَعْلَمُونَ ۞ إِنَّمَا يَتَذَكَّرُ أُولُو الْأَلْبَابِ (الزمر :9.99)

"Is one who is devoutly obedient during periods of the night, prostrating and standing [in prayer], fearing the Hereafter and hoping for the mercy of his Lord, [like one who does not]? Say, "Are those who know equal to those who do not know?" Only they will remember [who are] people of understanding)"

When observed closely by thoughtful minds, it can easily be realized that the level of piety signified by long night prayers in fear and anticipation of the hereafter, and by the hope for the mercy of Allah, are essential requirements for knowledge. The verse further praises knowledge, by conducting a comparison between those who know and those who do not. The conclusion implied in the question is that there is no comparison between the two. Hence, the value of knowledge in Islam is not only derived from the subject of that knowledge, but also from the intention in the attainment, the sincerity in the submission, and the quality in the implementation. The verse implies that piety is a qualifying quality that is necessary to compete in knowledge.
